

2. THEMATIC FOCUS

- Understanding the **territorial impacts of a series of crises** (ecological, socio-demographic, humanitarian, and sanitary including the recent Covid-19 pandemic, often termed as "**polycrisis**") on **Italian border areas**;
- Shifting the perspective on these marginal territories **from national "edge lands" and "peripheries" to "borderscapes"**, namely "constellations" of spaces, relations and practices emerged as resilient responses to the above-mentioned crises;
- Addressing such issues in a selection of **three case studies** located on Italian national borders (Italy-France, Italy-Austria, Italy-Slovenia).



3. OBJECTIVES

Objective 1:

Re-frame **cross-border cooperation and border management mechanisms in Europ**e before and after 2020, and understand what happened across and along EU member states' borders in the past years, with a specific focus on the Italian context and its bilateral relations;

Objective 2:


Identify in three study contexts both:

- a. the new **territorial fragilities** pushed by the multiple crisis;
- a. the **synergies and coping strategies** that have been activated by alliances of local stakeholders and citizens to provide bottom-up and/or institutional responses to the social and economic distresses caused by the sanitary emergency.

By doing so, also exploring the socio-cultural perceptions of national, regional and everyday tangible and intangible borders by local communities and how these have changed since 2020;

Objective 3:

Explore **pathways of resilient territorial development** among cross-border territories in a permanent crisis conditions / post-pandemic recovery phase, considering their (old and new) interdependencies, integrating the existing strategies, plans and policies at the regional and local scale.

4. RESEARCH QUESTIONS

To what extent have the institutional frameworks of cross-border cooperation and border management in Europe been influenced by the Covid-19 pandemic from 2020?

Which new forms of territorial fragilities and synergies and which strategies have emerged and been produced by alliances of local actors and citizens to provide solutions to the social and economic distress caused by the health emergency since 2020?

How to imagine new territorial development pathways, tools and practices of multi-level governance between cross-border territories in a post-pandemic recovery phase, considering their (old and new) interdependencies and the synergies activated by the emergency?

Which different perceptions of tangible and intangible (national, regional and local) borders have emerged among local communities?


5. METHODS & CASE STUDIES

- An inter- and trans-disciplinary approach between urban planning, political geography, and social sciences, aiming to create new knowledge among the different research units, with different expertise in the academic careers of the researchers involved.
- Emphasis on the integration between spatial, social and political sciences research methodologies, with particular attention on visual analysis and production (e.g. maps, plans, photographs and videos).
- → Three (macro) study contexts as main 'backgrounds' for the construction of specific case studies at different scales.

- Mapping and visual production on the three study context, at different scales;


WP2|Fieldwork

- Integrated content analysis;


